

Criteria and Norms for the Admission Test in Geography (Undergraduate Admissions, 2015)

Admission to the Undergraduate Degree Course in Geography at Presidency University, Kolkata for the 2015-2016 Session shall be on the basis of the cumulative score obtained by an candidate as tabulated and displayed in the Final Merit List, which shall be prepared on the basis of a combination of the Aggregate marks (of the top four subjects, excluding Environmental Science/Education), obtained at the +2 level examination and the marks obtained in the Admission Test conducted for Geography.

To meet the eligibility criteria, a candidate applying for admission to the Geography Degree must have secured a minimum of 75% in aggregate marks (of the top four subjects, excluding Environmental Science/Education) with any 3 of these 11 subjects (Physics, Chemistry, Mathematics, Biology, Stat, Eco, Political Science, Sociology, History, Geography, Geology) being part of their studied course at the +2 Level.

The Admission Test in Geography shall be wholly MCQ based. The Question Paper shall consist of a total of 40 questions, with each question being worth 2 marks. Each question shall have 4 answers given out of which the candidate shall choose the correct one. Each incorrect answer will incur a negative penalty, while a candidate choosing not to answer a particular question, shall not incur any penalty in that particular case.

The composition of the Admission Test Paper in Geography shall be as follows:

Total - 40 questions

18 Questions on Geography

09 Questions on English Grammar, Sentence Structure and Reading Comprehension

08 Questions on Basic Science and Mathematics

05 Questions on General Knowledge / General Intelligence
